Jashoman Banerjee, MD is a senior clinical fellow in the department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, division of Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility at the Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan. He had completed his medical school and residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology from Calcutta National Medical College, India and was a research fellow at the Center for Reproductive Medicine in Cleveland Clinic Foundation. He completed his residency training in the United States in Obstetrics and Gynecology from the University of Toledo Medical Center where he was nominated as the chief resident in the final year of the training. He is a member of the ASRM (American Society of Reproductive Medicine), SGI (Society of Gynecological Investigation), ACOG (American Congress of Ob-Gyn), AMA (American Medical Association) and associate member of SREI (Society of Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility).

Dr Banerjee has been publishing his research work since 2004 in esteemed peer reviewed journals and has more than 14 publications till now. His research interests include oocyte quality and oxidative stress, ovarian cryopreservation, clinical assisted reproduction techniques, endometriosis and role of oxidative stress in female infertility. He had presented his work in national meetings such as ASRM and SGI and regional meetings such as MWRS (Mid-West Reproductive Symposium), ACOG (Michigan section).

Dr Banerjee had won accolades for teaching medical students during his residency training and award for presenting his research work for ACOG Michigan section. Dr Banerjee had actively participated in training medical students, residents both in clinical and research fields in United States as well as in India.
